

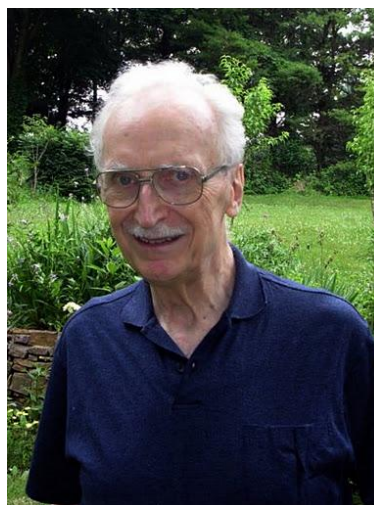

When racial laws were enacted in Italy in September 1938, the Calabis fled to France and then to the United States. Tullia, who studied philosophy and music in Milan, Paris and New York, became a renowned journalist and writer. Eugenio, after studying at MIT and Princeton, became an important mathematician.
