TIMELINE/DEADLINES FOR SPRING SEMESTER 2021

Please note that due to the on-going pandemic, the entirety of the Meltzer Internship will be conducted remotely. All planning meetings will be conducted over Zoom and all events must take place over Zoom or by remote means.

Events may take place anytime before the final day of classes for the Spring Semester: **April 29, 2021.**

Please note that *project proposals* must be submitted in a timely manner in order for projects to be approved before their scheduled date.

Schedule:

By Wednesday, February 17, 2021:

Submit a completed Jewish Studies Internship Application to Chrissy Walsh (chwalsh@sas.upenn.edu)

Friday, February 19, 2021:

Accepted interns meeting

By Monday, March 8, 2021:

Cement all plans for program/ event and submit a **written project proposal** (via email) at least 2 weeks in advance of your proposed date. Once the project has been approved, make all arrangements for technology needs, publicity, etc.

By Wednesday, March 24, 2021:

Last possible date on which to submit a **project proposal** for a program you wish to organize this semester.

Thursday, April 29, 2021:

Last possible date on which you may hold an event this semester. **No events/ programs may take place after Thursday, April 29, 2021, with no exceptions.**

Thursday, May 6, 2021:

Last day to submit all paperwork for reimbursements, honoraria, etc. We strongly recommend that you submit your paperwork to Chrissy Walsh as quickly as possible after your event.
